Transport and Logistic Industry in Germany

In recent years, the transport and logistics industry in Germany has made significant progress and remains a central pillar of the national economy. In 2023, the German logistics sector achieved a revenue of approximately 327 billion euros, with further growth to 331 billion euros expected in 2024.

This highlights the industry’s continued growth despite global challenges. German logistics companies are involved in areas such as freight forwarding, transportation, storage, handling, and packaging of goods and merchandise. With around 3.35 million employees, the sector represents the third-largest economic industry in Germany, following the automotive industry and trade. This underscores the importance of the logistics sector as both an economic driver and an employer.

The German logistics market is characterized by its high level of diversification. It includes various submarkets, such as construction materials logistics, hazardous goods logistics, pharmaceutical logistics, and trade fair logistics, each with specific requirements and specializations. Modern concepts like Just-in-Time and Just-in-Sequence delivery have become standard practices, enhancing efficiency. Technological advancements and sustainability initiatives are also key drivers in the transport and logistics sector. Companies are increasingly investing in digital solutions and environmentally friendly transport methods to meet the growing demands for efficiency and environmental compatibility. These developments are supported by funding programs and legislative measures from the Federal Ministry for Digital and Transport, aimed at ensuring the sector’s future viability.

Transport Logistic Trade Show in Munich

The transport logistic will take place from June 2-5, 2025 at the Munich exhibition center in Germany and is the world's leading trade fair for logistics, mobility, IT and supply chain management. The trade fair, which is accompanied by a conference program, presents the optimal solutions for every requirement. transport logistic combines innovative products, technologies, and systems with pooled expertise and a strong sales focus.

The exhibition is expected to fill twelve halls and will cover an exhibition area totaling around 150,000 square meters. More than 2,320 exhibitors from 67 countries and regions will present new products and professional services for transport and logistic.
